

AS THE NATIONAL DIRECTOR, I WILL...

- Ensure guidelines are clear, fair, and accessible to a diverse audience
- Address any inquiries or concerns related to the contest rules
- Coordinate the selection of judges from diverse backgrounds and expertise
- Ensure that judging criteria are well-defined and align with the contest's mission statement
- Monitor the judging process to guarantee fairness and impartiality
- Notify the submitting chapter/teacher of the winning poster(s)
- Coordinate the distribution of prizes and certificates to winners (Prizes will be sent to the school of the sponsoring teacher.)

Subvission Rules & Oznidelines

- For Georgia chapter teachers submitting students' entries to the Georgia
 Chapter Poster Contest
- 1. All poster entries must be submitted to the local/state chapter contest first. Please honor this rule; do not bypass the local/state contest. Entries that do will be disqualified. For the AATSP Geogia Chapter Poster Contest contact Sonia Puerta-Quinn at Squinneedsaugusta.com. Please note that the local chapter contest deadline is March 1st, 2025 a month before the National Contest deadline. Posters may not be submitted directly to the national contest because our AATSP Georgia chapter offers the Poster Contest.
- 2. Submissions must be digital and entered via the GA Chapter Google Submission Form. This form should be filled out for EACH entry. The window for submitting posters to the AATSP Georgia chapter is JANUARY 1 MARCH 1. The Georgia Chapter Google Submission forms may be found on the chapter's website beginning in January. Please make sure to use the following file name convention:

R__DR/DI/C category FIRST NAME_LAST NAME

(This format is explained in detail in the submission form video as well as in the submission form itself.)

- 3. When submitting photos, please make sure the image is uploaded in the correct orientation. For example, if the artwork is portrait, upload it as such. If it is landscape, upload it in that manner. In order to maintain the integrity of the artwork, please save and send the entry in a high-resolution .jpg or .png format, as close to full HD 1920px by 1080px as possible. The Google form will not accept a PDF or any other format.
- 5. Make sure the teacher AATSP membership is current, and that you have access to it.

How to find your AATSP Member ID Number:

- 1) Log into your AATSP account at <u>aatsp.org</u>
- 2) Click on the My Profile link.
- 3) Under My Profile click on Manage Profile.
- 4) Click on Info and Settings and find the AATSP Membership Card icon. Your membership ID and expiration date will be listed.

All posters submitted become the property of the AATSP. With submission of the entry, permission is automatically granted to the AATSP to use the poster image, the school's name, the sponsoring teacher's name, and the student's name.

** Please note the following changes this year: **

1. For the **DRAWING CATEGORY**, please note the drawing can be **DRAWN** using pencils, markers, crayons...etc. Artwork that is created entirely by hand using a **DIGITAL DRAWING TABLET and stylus** without the use of pre-existing images will be entered into the **DRAWING CATEGORY**.

ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR (DIGITAL) DRAWING CATEGORY:

- The artist must create all elements of the artwork by drawing **by hand** using a stylus **or** using other writing tools on paper.
- For digital drawing, no elements of the artwork should be created through photo manipulation, such as cutting, pasting, or blending existing images.
- Digital tools for enhancing hand-drawn elements (e.g., brushes, layers, effects) are permitted as long as they are applied to hand-drawn content.
- 2. For the **DIGITAL CATEGORY**, artwork that incorporates and manipulates pre-existing images or photographs (for example, Canva elements, clipart...etc.) to create a new piece of art will be considered **DIGITAL**. This includes but is not limited to photo editing, collage, and digital compositing.

ADDITIONAL CRITERIA FOR DIGITAL CATEGORY:

- The artist may use pre-existing images or photographs as part of the artwork.
- Techniques such as cutting, pasting, layering, blending, and altering images are permitted.
- Use of digital tools for photo editing and manipulation (e.g., Photoshop, GIMP) is permitted.
- 3. Originality: All submitted artwork must be original and created specifically for this contest. Plagiarism or unauthorized use of another artist's work is strictly prohibited. Depictions of cartoon, video game, movie, television, or theme characters, or recreations of past poster designs do not constitute creativity or originality. Absolutely **no** copyrighted images, figures, or wording are to be used. AATSP holds no liability for copyright infringement.
- 4. Artwork that is created using artificial intelligence (AI) algorithms or tools, including but not limited to image generators, deep learning models, and neural networks is not allowed. The National Contest Director, Committee, and judges reserve the right to request or seek additional information or evidence regarding any piece submitted to the contest. If it is determined that an entry was generated by AI, it will be disqualified.

By clearly distinguishing these categories and rules, the contest aims to celebrate the unique skills and creativity involved in both hand-drawn digital art and digital image manipulation.

Submission Criteria for Each Group

NOTE THAT REQUIREMENTS VARY BASED ON GROUP!

PreK-2nd grade

- poster (8 1/2 x 11" or bigger)
- written theme is optional but encouraged

3rd-5th grade

- poster (11 X 17" or bigger)
- written theme is required

6th-8th grade

- poster (11 X 17" or bigger)
- written theme included and creatively incorporated on the poster

9th-12th grade

- poster (11 X 17" or bigger)
- written theme included and creatively incorporated on the poster
- artist statement

As part of their submission, students in grades 9-12 need to write at least 5 complete and thoughtful sentences in Spanish/Portuguese (no penalty for errors) or English in which they share the following:

- 1. A title for their piece (honoring this year's theme)
- 2. An element and principle of art that was included in their work
- 3. A studio habit they learned or focused on during the process (This is defined in the article linked on the previous page).
- 4. The "why" of their piece (what helped them decide to draw what they drew)
- 5. Any other pertinent details they wish to share about their piece or experiences while creating it

This element aligns with current best practices in Art Education. Last year's judges provided positive feedback, expressing their enjoyment of gaining deeper insights into the artwork created by older students. They noted an enhanced ability to appreciate and understand the students' messages, thus fostering a stronger connection to the art.
